Ms. Pame Daniel is a parishioner of St. Justin Parish in Hartford. It was through her vision that the St. Justin Church Prison Ministry was started at Osborn State Correctional Center in Somers. She also participated in a program to assist women inmates at the Niantic Correctional Center. Her vision and action to reach out to the imprisoned has resulted in an average of 150 inmates who look forward to and participate in the celebration of Mass and fellowship. Besides being a mother and grandmother she opens her home to "wards of the state" and serves as a devoted foster mother and teacher for troubled Hartford youths. She also finds the time to feed the hungry and the homeless by volunteering her time and food at St. Elizabeth House in Hartford. She was instrumental in helping in the formation of the Caribbean Catholic Ministry in Hartford and was a co-founder of the St. Lucian Social Club, of which she serves as President. Besides being a choir member, she is also the President of the Martha & Mary Guild, member of the Parish Council, member of the West Indian Social Club, Red Cross Volunteer and Literacy Volunteer.
